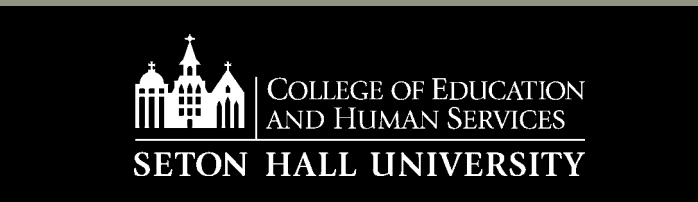

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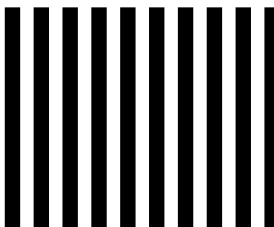

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ADVANCE YOUR EDUCATION AND YOUR CAREER

For more than a quarter century, Seton Hall University has offered qualified law enforcement officers, criminal justice professionals and government employees at the federal, state, county and municipal levels the opportunity to earn a Master of Arts degree in Human Resources Training and Development (HRTD). Through the years, Seton Hall's program has evolved to encompass an emphasis on the development of leadership, management and policy skills.

The program is delivered in two options: online/blended and traditional off-campus classes at various locations throughout NJ.

Online Option

The HRTD program provides a challenging and unique curriculum, delivered through an online format, completed over 36 credit hours and within six semesters. The program includes three weekend residencies on campus or at designated locations.

Tuition discounts

The University provides a significant tuition discount (50 percent) to all students who enroll in this program.

Admission Requirements

- An official copy of all undergraduate and graduate transcripts
- Three letters of reference attesting to the candidate's academic ability and personal qualifications.
- A one-page statement of goals and professional interests.
- An application fee of \$50

Degree Requirements

Students must satisfy all University, College and program criteria, including the completion of 36 credits with a graduate academic record of 3.0 to receive an M.A. degree.

Up to six graduate credits earned recently at another accredited college or university may be accepted for partial satisfaction of graduate degree requirements.
